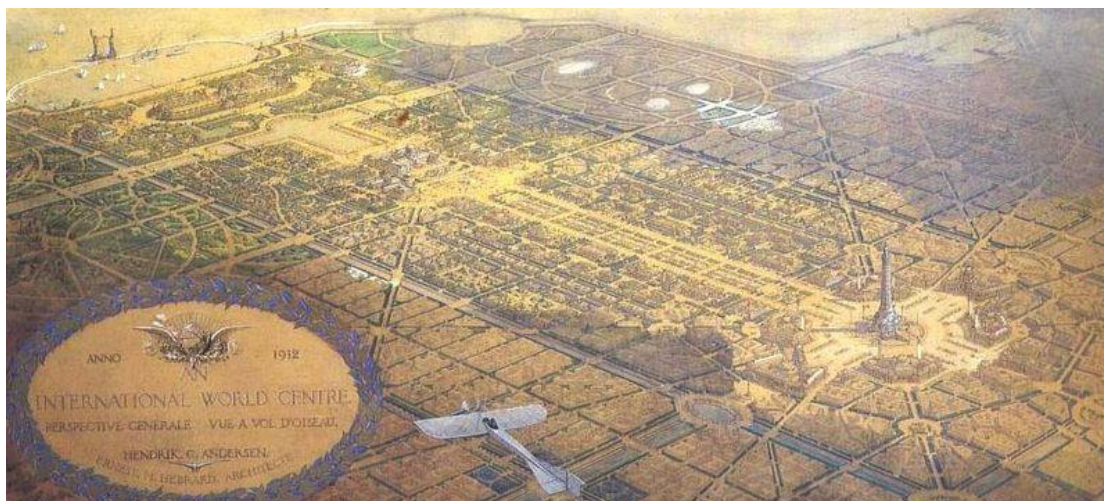


# Sites of International Memory, 15 July, 2016
